1. Policy Statement

Future Connect Training and Recruitment is committed to preventing learners from being drawn into terrorism and extremism. This policy aligns with the **Counter-Terrorism and Security Act 2015**, which places a statutory duty on education providers to have **"due regard"** to the need to prevent people from being drawn into terrorism (the Prevent Duty).

The Prevent Strategy seeks to:

- Safeguard learners from radicalisation and extremism.
- Ensure staff can identify risks of radicalisation and respond appropriately.
- Promote a culture of tolerance, inclusivity, and critical thinking.
- Work in partnership with external agencies to support vulnerable individuals.

2. Aims 1_{Page}

This policy aims to:

- Recognise the signs of radicalisation and extremist influences.
- Provide interventions and safeguarding measures to support learners at risk.
- Establish clear **reporting and escalation procedures** for suspected cases.
- Ensure compliance with the Prevent Duty.
- Promote **British Values** (democracy, rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect, and tolerance).

3. Definitions

- **Radicalisation** The process by which individuals come to support terrorism and extremist ideologies.
- **Extremism** Vocal or active opposition to fundamental British values.
- **Terrorism** The use or threat of action designed to influence government or intimidate the public, with the intent to advance a political, religious, or ideological cause.
- **Prevent Duty** The legal obligation on education providers to take steps to prevent people from being drawn into terrorism.

4. Roles and Responsibilities

4.1 Core Committee Responsibilities

The **Core Committee** has overall responsibility for ensuring compliance with Prevent Duty. Members include:

- Jagruti Patel Compliance Manager
- Abhishek Sharma Safeguarding Lead
- Sagar Allag Safeguarding Lead
- Palwi Sood Managing Director
- Vishal Sharma Compliance Manager
- Bhargav Gurjar Curriculum

Manager Key Responsibilities:

- Ensure that Prevent policies are implemented and reviewed regularly.
- Support staff with training and awareness of Prevent Duty.
- Work closely with **external agencies** (e.g., Channel Programme, local police, safeguarding boards).

4.2 Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) Responsibilities

The DSL, Umar Tariq, and Deputy DSLs (Jagruti Patel, Zeeshan Ahmed, Adeel Ali) are responsible for:

- Leading Prevent Duty efforts within Future Connect.
- Assessing and managing risks of radicalisation.
- Handling referrals to external agencies where required.
- Keeping accurate and confidential records of Prevent-related concerns.

4.3 Staff and Volunteer Responsibilities

All staff and volunteers must:

- Be aware of the signs of radicalisation.
- Report concerns to the DSL or Deputy DSLs immediately.
- · Complete Prevent training and refresher courses.
- Promote inclusivity, tolerance, and respect among learners.

5. Prevent Duty and Risk Management

5.1 Identifying Risks

Future Connect will:

- Conduct regular risk assessments to identify students at risk of radicalisation.
- Monitor external speakers, curriculum content, and online activities.
- Engage with learners to understand social and external influences.

5.2 Supporting Learners at Risk

If a learner is identified as at risk of radicalisation, Future Connect will:

- Work with external agencies such as the Channel Programme to provide early intervention.
- Offer **mentoring and support** to help learners challenge extremist narratives.
- Maintain confidentiality and safeguarding standards throughout the process.

5.3 Reporting and Escalation Procedures

- Concerns should be reported immediately to the DSL or Deputy DSLs.
- The DSL will assess the risk and, if necessary, make a referral to Prevent partners.
- In high-risk cases, Future Connect will inform the police or local Prevent team.
- All reports and actions taken will be recorded securely.



- All staff and volunteers will complete Prevent Duty training upon induction.
- Training sessions will be updated **bi-annually** to reflect emerging threats.
- Specialised training for DSLs, Safeguarding Officers, and Core Committee members will be provided.

7. Partnership and Inter-Agency Collaboration

Future Connect works closely with:

- Local Prevent Teams to stay updated on risks and best practices.
- Police and Channel Programme to refer individuals at risk.
- Local safeguarding partnerships and social services.

8. Review and Monitoring

- The Core Committee will review this policy annually.
- The **DSL** will provide a report on Prevent-related activities and concerns.
- Any incidents will be logged and assessed for improvements.
